White House Award for Express Care

Express Care, a Herndon-based nonprofit organization, received the Honor of Hope Award from President George W. Bush through the White House Office of Faith-Based and Community Initiatives.

"We have worked very hard to be recognized," said Naila Alam, Express Care CEO. She said the award from the White House is "the greatest honor."

Alam and Yasmeen Durrani, Express Care director and Alam's sister, received the award on Thursday, June 26, at the White House National Conference of Office of Faith-Based and Community Initiatives program. One nonprofit organization from each state was chosen for the award.

Currently the nonprofit is training 25 people through the Northern Virginia Workforce Investment Board to become personal care assistants. "We are trying to bring more people into the workforce," said Alam.
